Dear Parents/Carers,

I have noticed that there seem to be an increasing number of children not attending school in their full uniform. It is a requirement of our Academy that children come to school wearing the agreed uniform. Can I please remind you of the expectations below. Children who do not come to school dressed in the agreed uniform will receive a yellow letter and we will also text you on the same day too asking you to bring their required uniform to school.

Blazers (KS2)

- Must be worn at all times when walking around school.
- Must be worn when children come to assembly.
- Sleeves must not be pushed up.
- If children are warm in the classroom they can remove their blazer if they have had permission from the teacher – Blazers must then be hung on the back of the child's chair.
- If a child comes to school without a blazer, then the office is to send a text to parents asking them to bring it to school if possible.
- During playtime and lunchtime, children may go out in their blazer however they must keep their blazer on. Please remember that all children will need a coat over their blazer in bad weather conditions to ensure that the blazers don't get damaged and the children are nice and warm.

Tie/Shirt

- Required to be worn under blazers with the top button fastened at all times.

Jumpers (KS1)

- Must be worn when children come into assembly.
- If children are warm in the classroom then they must put their jumper in their tray or bag so it does not get lost.
- In warm weather children will wear their white polo top without a jumper.

Shirts and Polo Tops

- Must be tucked in at all times

Jewellery and Makeup

- Children with pierced ears may wear a small gold or silver stud only.
- No other form of jewellery is permitted.
- Children are not permitted to wear any type of make-up or nail varnish.

Additional Information

- Black shoes
- Grey socks/tights

Please ensure you replace trousers and skirts that become too small and short for your child and that trainers are not permitted. We have a duty of care to our children as parents. If you are struggling in any way to provide the appropriate uniform for your child/children please speak to the class teacher.
